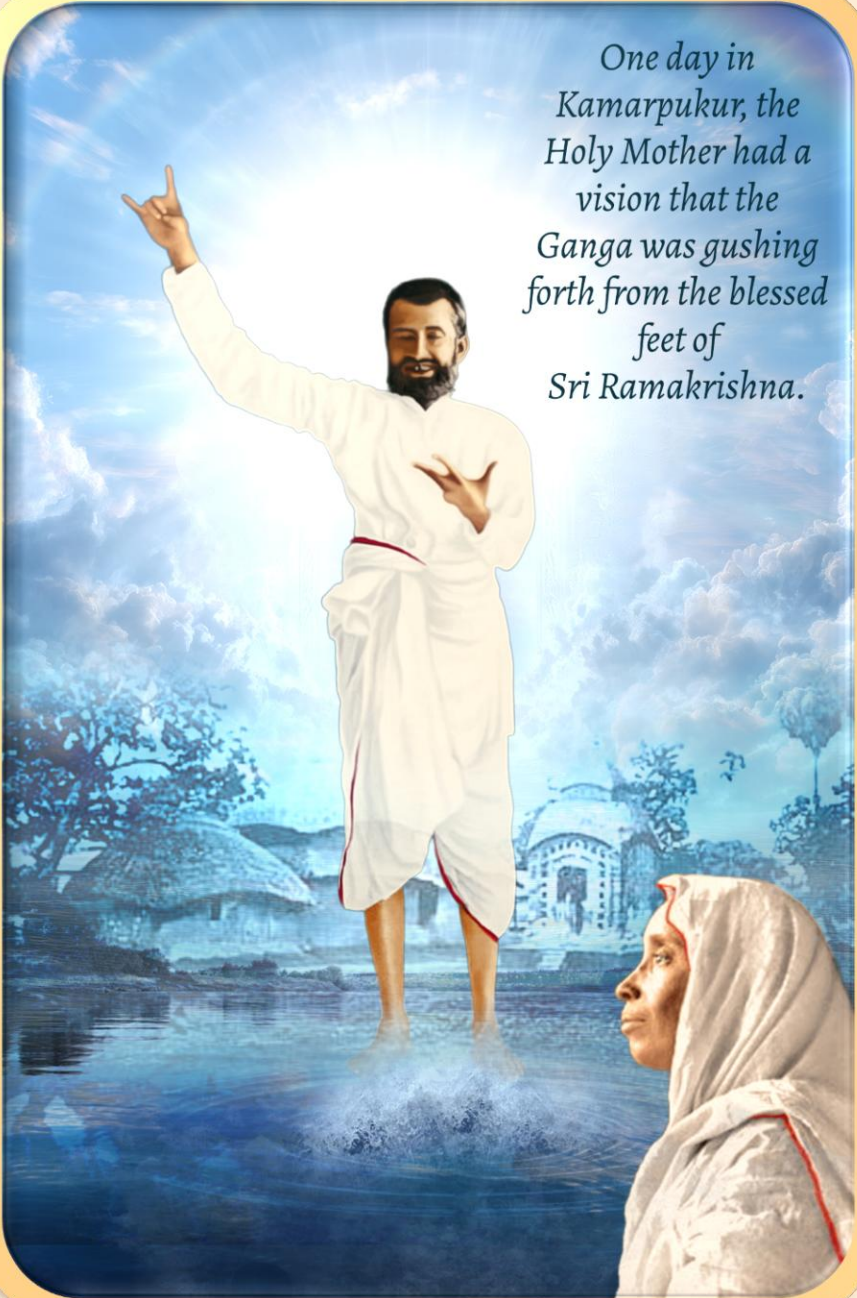

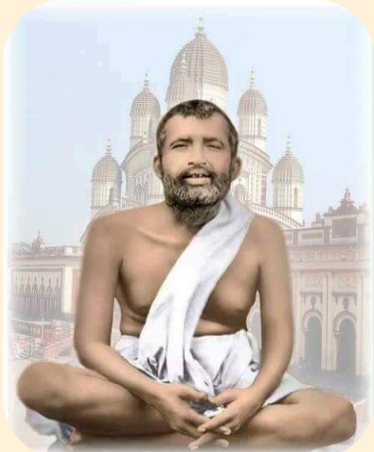

Period of Sri Ramakrishna's stay at Kamarpukur



1. First Stay: 1836-1853 (From his birth to his departure for Calcutta) (almost 17 years)

* Birth of Sri Ramakrishna, February 18, about 5:15 a.m.

* First trance of Gadadhar.

* Death of Kshudiram.

* Gadadhar's sacred thread ceremony.

*Gadadhar came to Kolkata.

2. Second Stay: September, 1854- May, 1855, (almost eight months): 1261-1262 (Ashwin-Jaistha) (Beng.)

3. Third Stay: June, 1855- Middle of July, 1856, (almost One year): 1262-1263, (Ashar-Shraban)

4. Fourth Stay: October, 1858- December, 1860, (almost Two years and two months): 1265-1267, (Ashwin- Kartik - Agrahayan) (Beng.)

5. Fifth Stay: June-December, 1867 (almost six months): 1274, (Jaistha-Agrahayan) (Beng.)

6. Sixth Stay: Middle of August-Middle of October, 1870 (almost 2 months): 1277, (Shraban-Ashwin)

7. Seventh Stay: January-February, 1876 (almost one month): 1282, (Poush-Magh) (Beng.)

8. Eighth Stay: Middle of June—End of September, 1876 (almost three and half months): 1283, (Ashar-Middle of Ashwin) (Beng.)

9. Ninth Stay: 1st July - Middle of September, 1877 (almost Two months and fifteen days)
: 1284, (Middle of Ashar - End of Bhadra) (Beng)

10. Tenth Stay: End of June—End of September, 1878 (almost three months): 1285, (First of Ashar-First of Ashwin) (Beng.)

11. Eleventh & Last Stay/visit: 3rd March-10th October, 1880 (almost Seven months and seven days): 1285, 21st Falgun-25th Ashwin) (Beng.)

Period of Holy Mother's stay at Kamarpukur



1. First Stay: May, 1859

At the age of five years, after marriage, the Holy Mother came to Kamarpukur for the first time. But in the next day she was taken back to Jayrambati by her uncle.

2. Second Stay: December, 1860

This year the holy Mother stayed at Kamarpukur for a short period.

3. Third Stay: May, 1866 (?)

When Sri Ramakrishna was immersed in the depth of Sadhana at Dakshineswar, the Holy Mother at the age of thirteen years came to Kamarpukur and stayed for one month.

4. Fourth Stay: December, 1866 - January, 1867

This time the Holy Mother stayed at Kamarpukur for one and a half month.

5. Fifth Stay: May-November, 1867

At the end of the Vedanta Sadhana, Sri Ramakrishna came to Kamarpukur from Dakshineswar with Hridayam and Bhairavi Brahmani. That time the Holy Mother at the age of fourteen years was brought to Kamarpukur from Jayrambati and stayed at Kamarpukur for about seven months.

6. Sixth Stay: 1885

The Holy Mother came to Kamarpukur on the occasion of the marriage of Ramlal.

7. Seventh Stay: September, 1887

After returning from Vrindavan, the Holy Mother spent nine months at Kamarpukur under extreme hardship condition. During this period, Gouri-Maa came to Kamarpukur and explained to the Holy Mother with the help of scriptures that her widowhood was not necessary as Sri Ramakrishna was her spiritual husband. One day the Holy Mother had a vision that the Ganga was gushing forth from the blessed feet of Sri Ramakrishna.

RAMAKRISHNA MATH AND RAMAKRISHNA MISSION



Belur Math

Ramakrishna Math and Ramakrishna Mission are worldwide, non-political, non-sectarian spiritual organizations which have been engaged in various forms of humanitarian, social service activities for more than a century. Although Ramakrishna Math and Ramakrishna Mission are legally and financially separate, they are closely inter-related in several ways and are regarded as twin organizations. The Ramakrishna Math and Ramakrishna Mission was established in the year 1897 and the headquarters of the Order is located at Belur Math, Howrah - 711202, West Bengal, India. So far 293 centers are spread over different parts of the world to propagate the teachings of Holy Trio as per the following ideals:

Ideal: Work as worship, potential divinity of the soul and harmony of religions are three of the noteworthy ideals on which these two organizations are based.

Motto: The motto of the twin organizations is *Atmano Mokshartham Jagadhitaya Cha*, “For one’s own salvation and for the welfare of the world”. It was formulated by Swami Vivekananda.

Activities: Educational Services, Medical Services, Relief and Rehabilitation Activities, Service in Rural and Tribal Areas, Training to religious & spiritual aspirants & Propagation of Sanatan Dharma.

Brief of Ramakrishna Math and Ramakrishna Mission, Kamarpukur



Bhagawan Sri Ramakrishna (1836 – 1886) was born on 18 February 1836 in the village of Kamarpukur about sixty miles northwest of Kolkata. His parents, Kshudiram Chattopadhyay and Chandramani Devi, were poor but very pious and virtuous. When Sri Ramakrishna was sixteen, his brother Ramkumar took him to Kolkata and after few months he was appointed a priest at Kali Temple at Dakshineswar. There he immersed himself in Sadhana of different religions for twelve years. With his unquenchable thirst for God, Sri Ramakrishna broke the frontiers of Hinduism, glided through the paths of Islam and Christianity, and attained the highest realization through each of them in a short span of time. He looked upon Jesus and Buddha as incarnations of God, and venerated the ten Sikh Gurus. He expressed the quintessence of his twelve-year-long spiritual realizations in a simple dictum: *“jato mat, tato path*, “as many faiths, so many paths.”- He affirmed that one must be sincere, earnest, regular and diligent in one’s spiritual practices to achieve the ultimate goal of human life i.e. realization of God. The Centre at Kamarpukur was affiliated to Headquarters of Ramakrishna Math and Ramakrishna Mission, Belur Math in 1947. Some of the significant holy places of Kamarpukur are:

Sri Ramakrishna's Birth Place:

According to the English calendar, on Thursday, 18th February 1836 (as per the Indian Almanac, Wednesday, Phalguni Shukla Dwitiya — the second day of the bright fortnight of Phalguna), Gadadhar

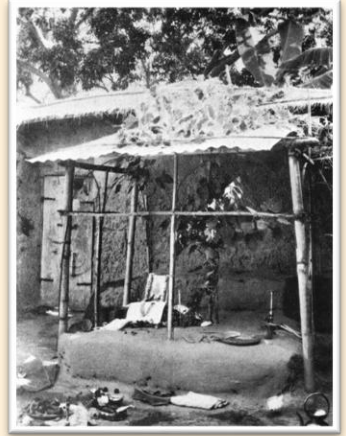
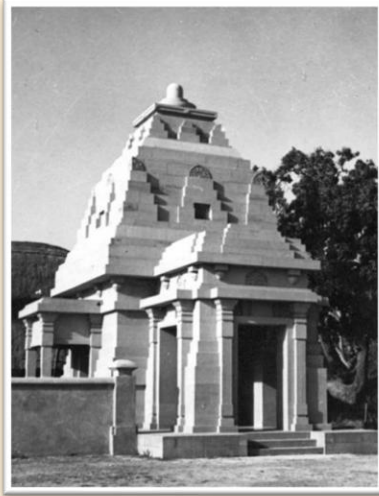

of His Birth place.

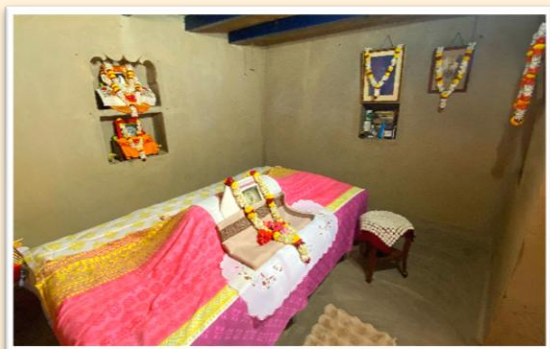
Sri Ramakrishna's Living-Room:

While at Kamarpukur, Sri Ramakrishna used to stay in the south-facing hut situated to the western side of the premises which is presently being used as part of the shrine of Sri Ramakrishna. Once he told the Holy Mother, “After my passing



away, you stay at Kamarpukur, grow greens, live upon this simple fare and spend your days in repeating the name of the Lord. Whatever

arrangements the devotees might lovingly make for you, don't let your own house at Kamarpukur be ruined”. That was why the Holy Mother lived in that hut after passing away of the Master, despite dire financial and other difficulties.



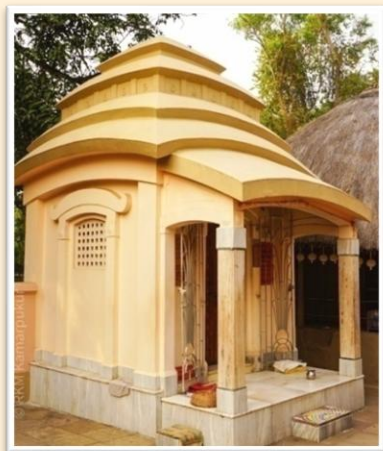
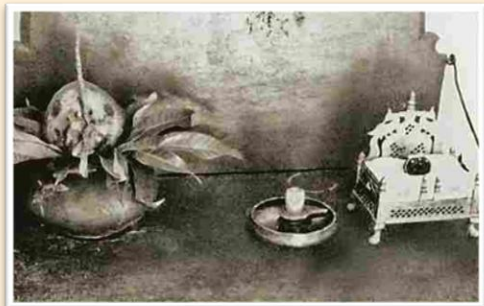
Ancestral home of Sri Ramakrishna, Kamarpukur

The Temple of Sri Raghuvira:



This was previously a small hut facing east. It had floor and walls of mud and a roof of straw. The present temple has been constructed exactly on the same spot with the same dimensions. In it, the Shalagrama Shila of Raghuvira (Rama), the earthen jar representing Goddess Sitala, the

Rameswara Shivalinga, an image of Gopala and the Shalagrama Shila of Narayana are worshipped every day. The last two deities were worshipped by Lakshmi Didi, niece of Sri Ramakrishna.

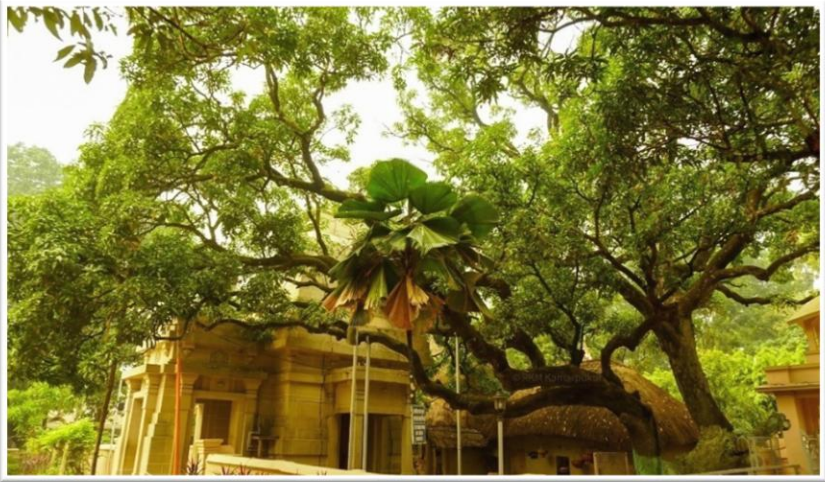

The Parlour and the Mango Tree:

In the parlour, Sri Ramakrishna used to meet people and instruct them. The Mango Tree which was planted by Sri Ramakrishna stands to the east of the parlour and still yields fruit.

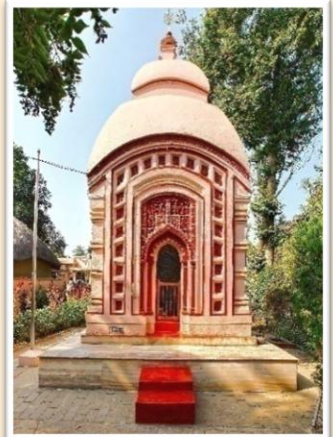


Yugi's Shiva Temple:



This temple is situated to the north of the residence of Sri Ramakrishna. In front of the temple, his mother had a divine vision. While speaking to Dhani, she suddenly saw a beam of celestial light which emerged from the

image of Shiva filled the temple and entered her body swiftly. Taken by surprise and overpowered with fear, she fell into a swoon. When she regained consciousness, she felt that the light was still in her womb and that she had conceived. The result was that Sri Ramakrishna was born.



Haldarpukur:

The vast water tank at the northern side of the Yugi's Shiva Temple is known as Haldarpukur. Many sweet memories of the boyhood days of Sri Ramakrishna center round this tank. On innumerable occasions, Gadadhar came here with his friends and swam sportively there. The water of the tank has become sacred as Sri Ramakrishna, his father Kshudiram and the Holy Mother used to bathe in it.



Lakshmijala:

'Lakshmijala' is situated to the west of Haldarpukur. It is a paddy field. After leaving Derepur, Sukhlal Goswami of Kamarpukur gifted Kshudiram Chattopadhyay a few huts of his homestead and also a small plot of paddy field measuring about half an acre which Kshudiram gratefully accepted and lived there happily. By the grace of Raghuvira, the land was soon producing so much rice that it became more than sufficient for the little family. The surplus was given to guests and visitors.

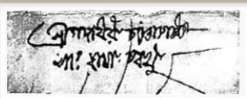
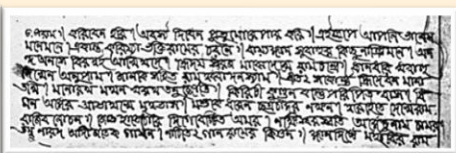




Kshudiram hired the farmers to plough the field; when the seedlings were ready, he would transplant a few bunches while taking the name of Raghuvira and then talking to farmers to finish the job.

The Primary School of the Lahas:

The school was held in the spacious Natmandir in front of Sri Durga Temple of Lahas where Gadadhar used to take school lessons at his early age. In a short time, he learnt to read and write, but soon his interest changed and he developed a tendency to get merged in ecstatic moods at the sight of beautiful scenery or in contemplation of particular deities. The boy liked the recital of the Puranas and the performance of village dramas more than his school lessons. His handwriting was good. The plays of Subahu and Yogadya which Gadadhar copied are still preserved in the Belur Math.

Temple of Gopeswar Shiva:

This ancient temple is situated to the east of Sri Ramakrishna's house. Either Sukhlal Goswami, who helped Kshudiram to settle at Kamarpukur, or his forefather Gopilal Goswami had founded this temple with a big Shivalinga. When Sri Ramakrishna was passing through ecstatic moods at Dakshineswar, his mother hearing the report that Gadadhar had turned mad, got alarmed and went to Gopeswar Temple, where she practiced



hard penances to get the divine grace for the cure of her son's madness. Then she heard a voice directing her to do likewise before the Shiva of Mukundapur. As a result of her penances, she was assured that her son was not mad at all.

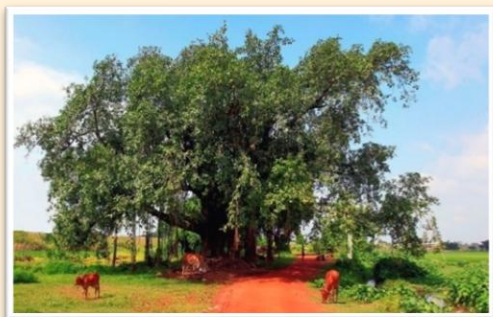
Sitanath Pyne's House:

Sitanath Pyne was a man of mediocre means. His house was to the south of the Lahas. Gadadhar used to go there in his boyhood days. When he was about 12 or 13 years old, he used to have ecstatic trances while singing devotional songs, or reading holy books like the Ramayana and the Mahabharata there. The women of the village then worshipped him as the embodiment of Sri Chaitanya or Sri Krishna. Once on the occasion of the Shivaratri, there was an arrangement for the performance of a village drama. As the boy was to act as Shiva fell suddenly ill, Gadadhar was persuaded to play that role.



But as soon as he came to the stage decked with matted locks, Rudraksha beads and ashes, he fell into a deep trance which lasted very long and the performance had to be stopped.

Budhui Moral Cremation Ground:



To the east of the village of Kamarpukur, lies the cremation ground. While staying at Kamarpukur, Sri Ramakrishna used to go there now and then to spend much of his time in contemplation.

Cremation Ground and Banyan Tree at Bhutir Khal:

This cremation ground is situated at the north-west of Sri Ramakrishna's house. When Sri Ramakrishna came home after his strenuous austerities at Dakshineswar at the age of 22, he used to go there and to the other cremation ground (Budhui Moral) for spiritual practices. There is an old Banyan tree under which he used to meditate during the greater part of the night. He also planted a Bilwa tree there.



Palace of Manik Raja:

Manik Chandra Bandopadhyay of Bhursubo Village was renowned in the area for his great benevolence and so he became known as “Manik Raja”. To the west of Bhutir Khal he reared an extensive mango grove for the public. His garden became the playground of Gadadhar and his friends. With the passage of time, it has become a paddy-field. There are many other incidents mentioned in Sri Sri Ramakrishna Lila-Prasanga about the intimacy of Gadadhar with Manik Raja.



Dhani Kamarini’s Birth Place and Temple:

It is situated to the south-east of the Sri Ramakrishna’s house. Recently, a small temple has been built on that site by some devotees and also an oil painting of Dhani with the child Gadadhar in her lap has been placed. In that temple the photo of Sri Ramakrishna is worshipped. Once Boy Gadadhar promised Dhani that at the time of his investiture with



the sacred thread he would accept alms from her. But it was contrary to that custom to accept alms from a non-brahmin on such an occasion. So, his elder brother objected to it; but Gadadhar was adamant to keep his word to Dhani. And so, he kept his word.



Chinu Shankhari's Birth Place:

Srinivas (alias), though not born in a high family, had great devotion to God. His relation with the boy Gadadhar was very sweet. He had a strong faith that Gadadhar was a divine being and loved him dearly. He was afraid that he might die before he could witness the unfoldment of his divine play. One day he fed Gadadhar with sweets and prayed for his grace. Even when Sri Ramakrishna grew up, he kept loving Srinivas. After



his sadhana periods, whenever Sri Ramakrishna visited Kamarpukur, Srinivas spent his time with him in religious discourses. Later, the master often referred to his deep-seated devotion and love. Chinu's house was situated to the north-east of the Sri Ramakrishna's house. Though the house no more exists, a magnificent beautiful memorial building is built on the same land and maintained by Ramakrishna Math, Kamarpukur.

Mukundapur Shiva Temple:

It is situated to the south-west of Sri Ramakrishna's Birth Place. On being directed by Gopeswar Shiva, Gadadhar's mother went to this temple and lay there without food and drink, praying for the recovery of Gadadhar from his supposed madness. She, however, felt comforted when she heard a divine voice saying "don't be afraid, your son is not mad; he has become like this because of divine intoxication". It is said that from that time onwards many people have got their prayers fulfilled by practicing such penances before the deity.



Anur Vishalakshi Temple:

The village called Anur is situated about 3 km away to the north of Kamarpukur. Goddess Vishalakshi of Anur is a very popular deity. One day a few ladies of Kamarpukur and its neighborhood were going in a group to offer worship to Vishalakshi when the eight-year-old Gadadhar also accompanied them. He recited from memory beautiful verses and sang songs about the deities, while walking with them. But while singing



the glory of Vishalakshi, his body became stiff. Tears flowed down his cheeks and his voice also choked. The ladies felt extremely anxious. Prasanna, the devoted daughter of Dharmadas Laha, was also present in the party. All on a sudden it occurred to her mind that it might be due to the mystic influence of the Goddess on the simple child who had great faith in her. When she spoke it out, all others believed it. They

prayed to the Goddess repeatedly saying, “Oh Mother Vishalakshi be pleased; save us Mother; please look upon us with compassion.” Wonder of wonders! Immediately the face of Gadadhar brightened up with a sweet smile and gradually consciousness came back. The ladies felt relieved and with their hearts overflowing with devotion, they went to the temple, offered their worship duly and returned home.

Guest House:

Being the birthplace of Bhagwan Sri Ramakrishna and the epicentre of Ramakrishna Movement, thousands of devotees visit this Maha-Tirtha from various parts of the world to get spiritually refreshed and elevated. We have arrangements for limited Guest House and Dormitory having basic facilities/amenities which can be booked (via **email: guesthouse@kamarpukurmath.org**) by the devotees to spend a few days in a divine and tranquil atmosphere of the Math and go back with renewed enthusiasm to spend meaningful lives.

ACTIVITIES OF RAMAKRISHNA MATH - SPIRITUAL, RELIGIOUS AND CULTURAL

Beginning of the 75th Year of Temple Dedication

On 11th May 1951, the temple at Kamarpukur, the sacred birthplace of Sri Ramakrishna, was dedicated in a historic and soul-stirring ceremony. With



the enshrinement of Thakur's relics and the installation of his holy image, Kamarpukur became a radiant center of devotion, drawing thousands who felt the Master's living presence. That moment, born of decades of sacrifice and effort, remains a timeless milestone in the history of the Ramakrishna Movement.

On 13th May 2024, the beginning of the 75th year of this Temple Dedication was observed with devotion and simplicity. The day commenced with Mangalarati at the shrine of Sri Ramakrishna. A small altar for Mother Chandi was set beside the main temple, where worship was offered with deep reverence.



Mother Chandi was worshipped through Shodasha Puja, using sixteen sacred articles. This was followed by Chandi Paath and the solemn performance of Shapta-shati Homa, conducted by Swami Tattwavidanandaji Maharaj,

Assistant General Secretary, Belur Math. The sacred fire ritual, performed in the presence of many monks and devotees, filled the atmosphere with powerful vibrations.

In the evening, a special lecture was delivered by Swami Balabhadranandaji Maharaj, Assistant General Secretary, Belur Math. He spoke with devotion and scholarship about the dedication of the temple in 1951, quoting historical incidents and records of that unforgettable event. His talk was later made available online in a YouTube video titled *"Here It All Began."* Following this, Swami Shivapradanandaji Maharaj, Secretary, Ramakrishna Mission, Purulia, also spoke, reflecting on the temple's journey and significance.

Gadadhar Abhyudaya Prakalpa (GAP)

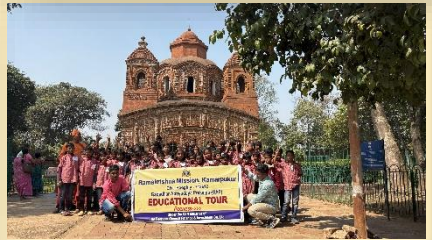
This year also “Gadadhar Abhyudaya Prakalpa” is continued for the children between the age of 6 years to 12 years with the aim of physical, mental and Intellectual development of the children. The project was initiated in 2010 to commemorate the 150th Birth Anniversary of Swami Vivekananda. There are two units under this project. One at Kamarpukur (Chinushankarir Bhite) and another located at Paschim Amarpur village (Manikraj's Mango Grove) which is 4 Kms away from Kamarpukur. The Kamarpukur unit is having 67 Children while at Paschim Amarpur unit there are 55 Children.

The children are provided with daily Nutritious food items along with milk. All necessary educational materials together with uniforms, school bags, chappal, winter garments and toiletry items are being supplied to them regularly.

To make the children healthy, medical check-up Camp is conducted twice in a month. Necessary treatment is also provided by the doctors. An educational tour is conducted annually for the balanced growth of the students with exposure to different places with diverse culture. The total expenditure for running the project in these two units is borne by The Ramakrishna Math, Kamarpukur.

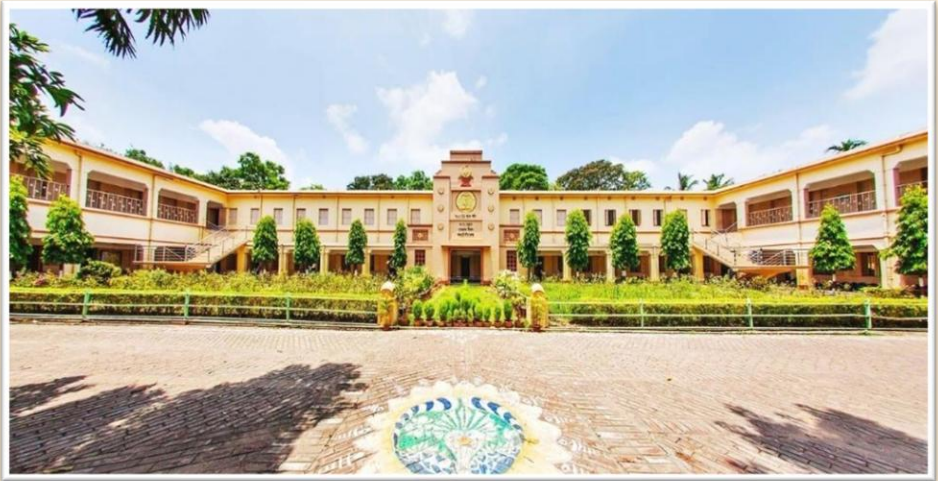

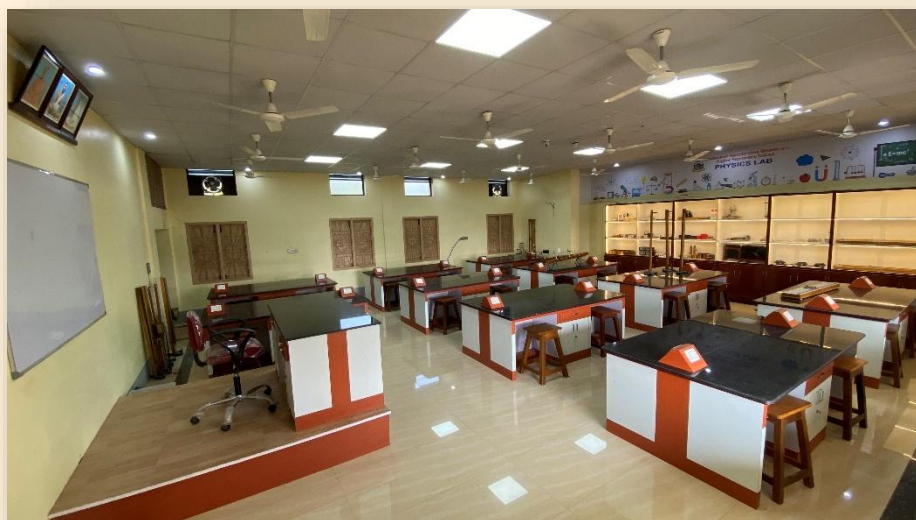

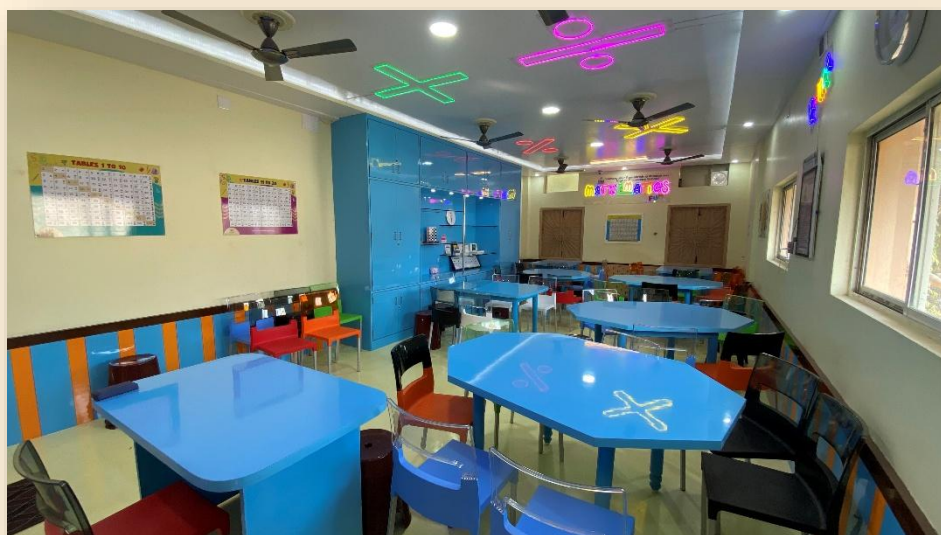

Capacity Building for Sustainable Livelihood:

Ramakrishna Mission Pallimangal is the wing of integrated rural developmental work of Ramakrishna Mission, Kamarpukur, Hooghly, West Bengal. This has successfully been running with several rural developmental programme including self-reliance vocational training and production as well as marketing support system in weaving, handicrafts, incense sticks making and food processing with a primary objective of helping the poor and destitute women by providing them some opportunities of income generation and thereby improving their economic as well as social status.

A brief description of the programme implemented during the year 2024-25 is mentioned below:

Food Processing Unit:

This unit was launched during the year 2001 with an objective of promoting Cottage Industries with a locally available resources, minimizing wastage of perishable vegetables/fruits like Tomato, Mango, Guava, Pineapple etc. and for attracting the farmers as a new source of marketing as well as income. At present various items like Pickle, Jam,

Jelly, Sauce, Squash, Kasundi, Papad, Snacks and Ghee are being produced in our units which have very good response and demand from the customers.

Non-Formal Education:

Due to socio-economic difficulties, a considerable part of our rural population is yet to see the light of education. In this context, Pallimangal has been conducting a number of Non-formal Education centres at different villages to provide minimum literacy to them. Books, notebooks, teaching materials, school dresses, umbrellas, sataranjees, jugs and bags are distributed to every student during the year. Presently 36 such NFE centers are being continued for the backward and down-trodden classes of children by Pallimangal in 28 villages under 16 Gram Panchayet areas and one in Tarakeswar Municipality through active involvement of village level organizations. 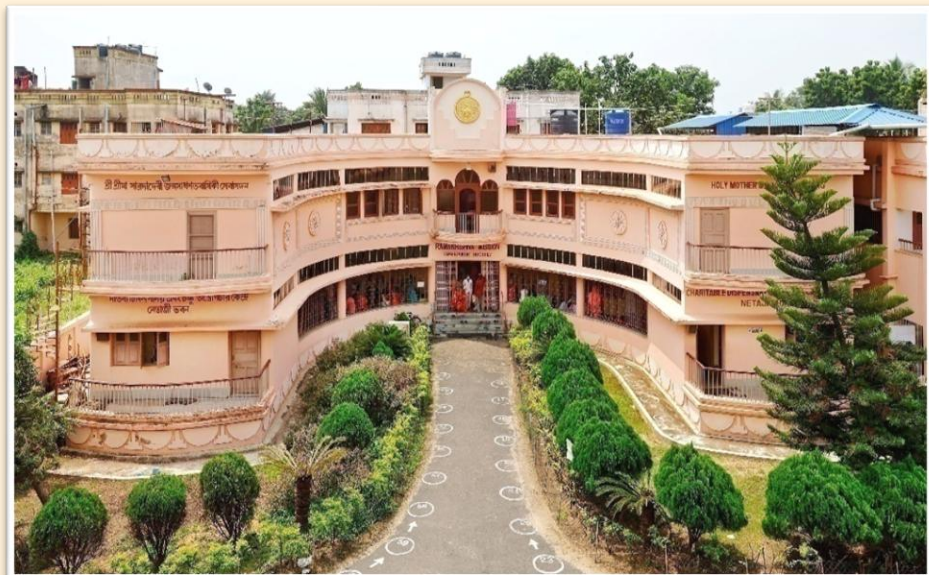

National Programme for Control of Blindness:

This programme was started in the year 1982 at free of cost for the deserving patients. A well-equipped eye day care center was established through which the poor and downtrodden village people of the adjacent areas of four districts e.g. Hooghly, Bankura, Burdwan and West Midnapur are being served on a regular basis since May, 2005. A good number of eminent ophthalmic surgeons, ophthalmic assistants, physicians, O.T. Sisters, Staff, devotees and volunteers are involved and always co-operating in this programme.

Screening for operation IOL, scanning of eye, Biometry for power testing of IOL, operation itself, refraction, medical treatment, spectacles distribution, health education and referral service, investigation facilities are being provided at Ramakrishna Mission Charitable Dispensary & Eye (Day) Care Centre, Kamarpukur.

RAMAKRISHNA MISSION PALLIMANGAL (MEDICAL UNIT)

This Medical Unit of Ramakrishna Mission Pallimangal is working in the field of health & health education for economically & socially backward communities. The main projects under this unit are 1) National Leprosy Elimination Programme (NLEP) and 2) Revised National Tuberculosis Control Programme (RNTCP).



Health Awareness Program

National Leprosy Elimination Programme(NLEP) :

“I should see God in the poor and it is for my salvation that I go and worship them. The poor and the miserable are for our salvation, so that we may serve the Lord, coming in the shape of the distressed, coming in the shape of lunatic, the Leprosy afflicted person. Bold are my words and let me repeat that it is the greatest privilege in our lives that we are allowed to serve the lord in all these shapes.” – Swami Vivekananda

Few years back, Leprosy was one of the burning public Health Problems in and around the Arambagh Sub-division in West Bengal. Considering the need Ramakrishna Mission Pallimangal has started this programme in July, 2001. The programme was envisaged with general survey, early case detection, diagnosis and MDT treatment, retrieval of the defaulter, Inter-personal IEC, Group IEC. Similarly Passive case detection and referral service to the PHC for diagnosis and treatment, Inter-personal

IEC, Group IEC, Contact survey, DPMR management, SER activity etc. are being taken up by Ramakrishna Mission in the above-mentioned areas of Arambagh Sub-division. Total population is about 4.5 lakhs in the project area. The specific geographical areas have been entrusted to eight Field Workers (PMW), One Supervisor (NMS) and One Doctor.

Revised National Tuberculosis Control Programme (RNTCP):

This programme has been started since 2002 in collaboration with CARE India under Scheme II. Now the service is continuing under Scheme-IV of RNTCP programme with direct supervision of District and State Govt. Health Department. It is a designated Microscopy and Treatment Centre (DMCTC) under Arambagh TU since 2007. Now this programme is carried out under DMCTC Scheme. During the year, Sputum examination for early detection for suspected cases and the confirmed patients are treated through our treatment centre & referred to the different sub-centres under Arambagh T.U.

Our activities of this programme like, DOTS treatment service, follow up the cases, defaulter retrieval, health education to the affected person and his/her family members, Inter-personal IEC, sensitization of the common people etc. are being continued.

National HIV AIDS Control Programme:

AIDS is one of the major burning public Health Problems in India since recent past. This programme has been started since 2006. The areas are allotted to Goghat-1 and Goghat-2 Blocks, Arambagh Block, Arambagh under NACP project. The programme envisages Inter personal IEC, Group IEC and Health education campaign in the project area. The specific geographical areas have been entrusted to Seven Field Workers (PMW).

Dairy



The Math houses a 'Goshala' or cow shed having 60 high-milch cows. Unlike other cow sheds, the one at the Math adopts a procedure of hygienic cattle-care. For this, there is a separate trained work-force. Fodder and medication are given as per prescription from eminent veterinary experts. Average daily 225 liters of milk is produced. An average of 20 – 25 liters of milk is consumed in distributing among 115 boys residing in our school hostel. An average of 13 liters of milk is consumed in distributing among the students under Gadadhar Abhyudayprakalpa (GAP), thrice in a week.



Youth Cell

It was Swamiji's desire that the youth should have life-building, man-making, character-building education, and that they should stand up on their own feet and take up the responsibility. He has reposed great faith in the coming generations.

With the aim to impart Swamiji's ideas of Human Excellence, however, a small measure it be, Ramakrishna Math, Kamarpukur has started a "Youth Cell" from 28th July 2019.

Since then, every Sunday the youth between the age group of 18 to 35 visit the Math and under the guidance of the Monastic member, they spend 3-4 hours in the holy atmosphere of the Math. They are engaged in reading spiritual books, group discussions and in some kind of Seva work. Average 25-30 youth participate in the event.
